## **SECOND READING OF ORDINANCE #629**

The ordinance was read aloud by City Clerk Amy Haynes. Under discussion, Councilman Fackler asked if this was the only option for the pay increase. Currently the City only has accounts with Meade County Bank and Wesbanco. City Clerk Amy Haynes advised that the LGEAF account would be the current account that we will relocate from Wesbanco to the Cecilian Bank. Mayor Pace stated we would look at moving an account from Meade County Bank to Cecilian Bank also in the future. A motion was made by Mark Spry, seconded by Charlotte Ford, to approve the transfer of the account. Vote of motion was unanimous.

## RE-APPOINTMENT OF QUINN LYNCH TO THE MC/BBURG INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

Mayor Pace advised that Mr. Lynch had served out the remainder of the vacated term of Bryan Claycomb on the Industrial Authority Board. A motion was made by Bruce Fackler, seconded by Ginger Coomes, to reappoint Quinn Lynch to the board for a 3 year term. Vote of motion was unanimous.
